PROJECT DESCRIPTION

OTDF actively work alongside the 147,000 river residents of the Community Mine Continuation Agreement (CMCA) corridor, living in 158 villages throughout Western Province. While working to enhance and improve everyone's quality of life throughout Western Province, OTDF's primary focus for 2020 – 2025 is: Agribusiness (delivering the WestAgro Master Plan), building Women's Capacity and Entrepreneurship, and enabling community Self-Sustainability. Project Description

A 162m footbridge across Ok-Tedi River. This was a Design and Construct (D&C) contract awarded to Wildcat Construction Limited for a contract value of K10.8m. The 162m long x 1.4 m wide bridge was built in 3 spans across the fast flowing OK Tedi River and included culverts and approach works.

 - Oversee commissioning and handover of the completed project including assessment of the defect punch lists for action by the Contractor; and Ensure compliance with standards, specifications and quality plan
 - Cost Control monitoring of project costs and contractor's expenditure against cash flows and preparing monthly reports to
 indicate the project financial status; establish, maintain and update regularly an overall Project Budget; monitor the defined
 scope of works with the work proposed to be undertaken by the Contractor;
 - o Monitor the Contractor's Cash Flow on a regular basis and advise the Client as required;
 - Contractor's programme assessment of contractor's extension of time claims and monitoring of contractor's performance against his programme; and
 - Contract Management conforming of the contract, management and administration of the contract, concluding the contract
 on completion and reporting. Verification, assessment, adjustment and recommendations as to payment of contractor's
 progress claims, management of variations, provisional sums, prime cost sums and contingency allowances.

Quality Assurance Testing and Construction Monitoring:
